Biosphere 2 Center
Situating on 250 acres, amidst the beautiful Sonoran Desert, Biosphere 2 is one of the largest living laboratories of the world. A monumental feat of engineering, the glass and metal shell hosts several different land types, or biomes, where scientists use the latest technology to experiment on Earth systems on a relatively large scale. Explore these and five other wilderness ecosystems on the World of Discovery tour. Cochise County-Land of Legends
Do it all in just a few days without ever leaving Cochise County. Located in the Southeast corner of Arizona, this is one of the most culturally, historically and geographically diverse areas in the American Southwest: Benson, Bisbee, Douglas, Tombstone, Sierra Vista and Willcox - legendary communities within a short drive of one another - less than a day's journey by stagecoach, it's said.

Colossal Cave Mountain Park
Colossal Cave, which is on the National Register of Historic Places, had been used for centuries by prehistoric peoples when it was "discovered" in 1879. Since then it has been the object of interest and attention by people ranging from train robbers to a President of the University of Arizona. Kartchner Caverns State Park
Kartchner Caverns is a stunning limestone cave in Southeastern Arizona and boasts many world-class features that have been protected since the cave was discovered in 1974. The cavern has been surveyed at 2.4 miles long. Kartchner is a wet, "live" cave. Water percolates from the surface and calcium carbonate features continue to grow in the darkness. The park is located 9 miles south of I-10 on Hwy 90. (520) 586-CAVE

Old Pueblo Trolley - An Operating Transit Museum
Ride by rail along the 4th Avenue business district, a remarkable variety of shops and restaurants. Turning onto University Blvd., the trolley passes historic, beautifully restored homes and buildings, housing, boutiques and cafes. Our route terminates near the Marriott Hotel, the Arizona Historical Society and the main gate of The University of AZ.

Arizona Sonora Desert Museum
The Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum is a world-renowned zoo, natural history museum and botanical garden, all in one place! Exhibits re-create the natural landscape of the Sonoran Desert Region so realistically you find yourself eye-to-eye with mountain lions, prairie dogs, Gila monsters, and more. Within the Museum grounds, you will see more than 300 animal species and 1,200 kinds of plants. There are almost 2 miles of paths traversing 21 acres of beautiful desert.

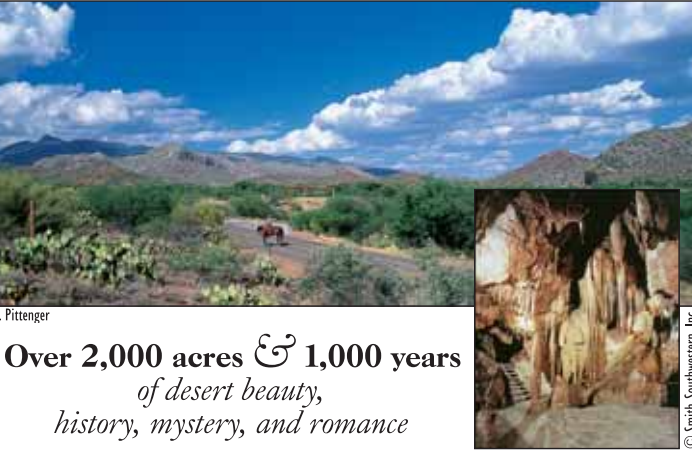

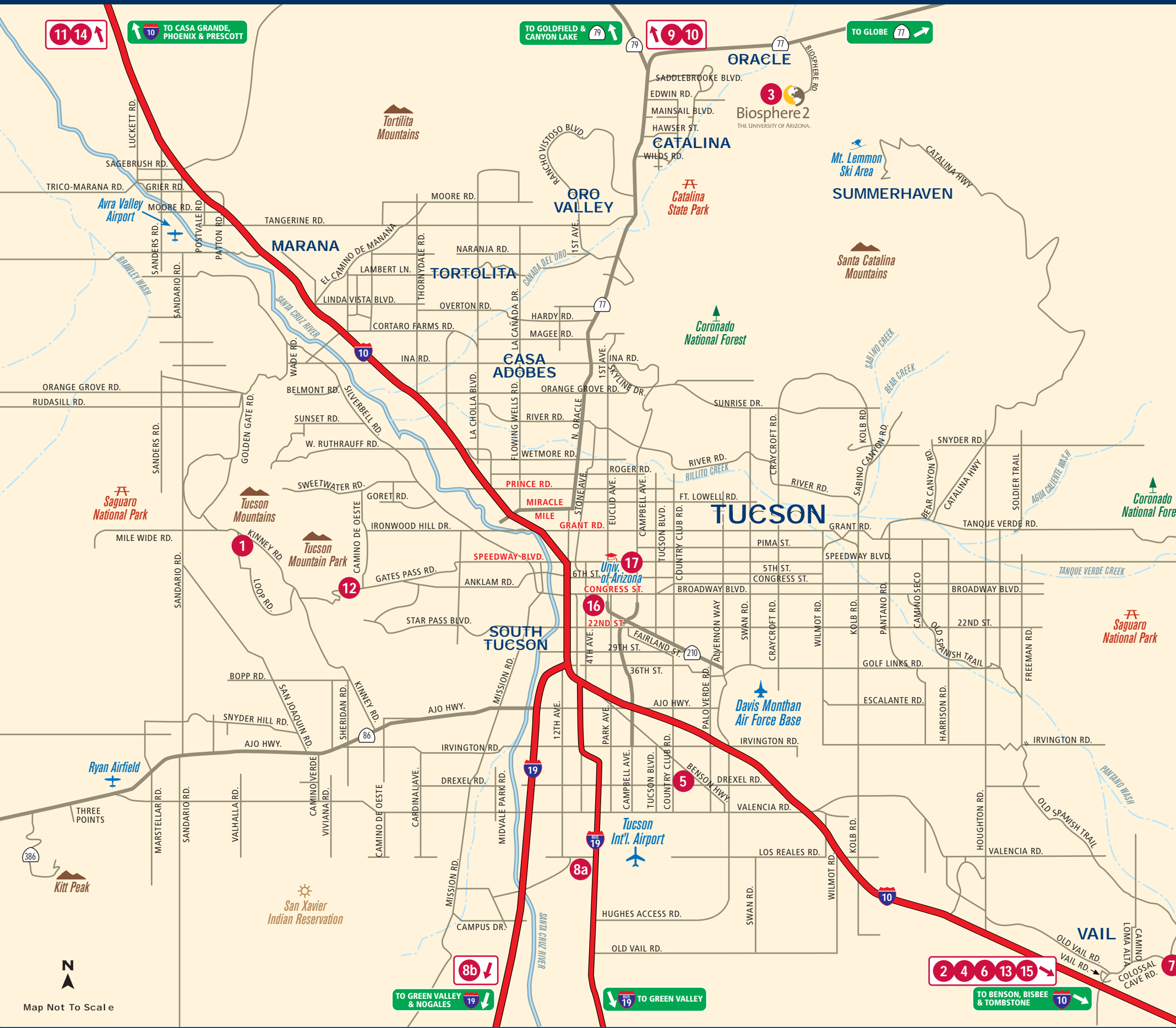
