Biosphere 2 Center

Situated on 250 acres, amidst the beautiful Sonoran Desert, Biosphere 2 is one of the largest living laboratories of the world. A monumental feat of engineering, the glass and metal shell hosts several different land types, or biomes, where scientists use the latest technology to experiment on Earth systems on a relatively large scale. Explore these and five other wilderness ecosystems on the World of Discovery tour. Sierra Vista

Southern Arizona Bird Watching
Located at the center of one of the finest birding
areas in the United States, Sierra Vista is often
referred to as "The Hummingbird Capital of the
U.S." The mild climate, proximity to Mexico and
diverse habitats, including 9,000-foot mountains
and the magnificent San Pedro River Valley, make
southeastern Arizona a major hot spot for rare and
unusual species of birds.

Kartchner Caverns State Park

Kartchner Caverns is a stunning limestone cave in Southeastern Arizona and boasts many world-class features that have been protected since the cave was discovered in 1974. The cavern has been surveyed at 2.4 miles long. Kartchner is a wet, "live" cave. Water percolates from the surface and calcium carbonate features continue to grow in the darkness. The park is located 9 miles south of I-10 on Hwy 90. (520) 586-CRVE
